Why Schools Need Rainbows

What our program can do for children and teens:

- Improve school attendance, behavior and academic performance;
- Strengthen problem-solving skills
- Help alleviate depression and anxiety
- Reduce emotional pain and suffering
- Improve communication skills;
- Reduce the likelihood of destructive behavior such as gangs, alcohol and substance abuse.
- 7 out of 10 teachers have at least one grieving student currently in their classroom
- 93% of teachers have never received bereavement training

Our Curriculum Includes:



Sunbeams (Pre-School)

Children ages 3 - 4 have an opportunity to grieve the loss in their family and develop appropriate coping skills for life. The process involves weekly meetings with a trained Facilitator in small groups of no more than five children.



Rainbows Level 1 – 4 (K-8)

Elementary-aged children speak about their feelings and share their grief in a safe environment in small group settings. The groups are led by trained facilitators utilizing age-appropriate materials.

- Level 1 - 5 to 6 years
- Level 2 - 7 to 8 years
- Level 3 - 9 to 11 years
- Level 4 - 12 to 14 years



Spectrum (High School)

Teens share feelings and thoughts about their loss with others their own age that are experiencing similar life changing events.
